Saturday Night – Open Heifer and Feeder Steer Show for all Alabama Youth ages

7-21 years old by January 1, 2009. We will have 4 divisions – British, Continental, Brahman Influenced, and Commercial. Registered heifers will be shown by age, commercial and feeder steers will be shown by weight. Supreme Champion heifer will be selected from Champion of each of the 4 divisions.

Purebred Heifers born after August 31, 2007

Commercial Heifers will be shown by weight

Purebred Bulls born after August 31, 2007

Feeder Steers will be shown by weight

Showmanship Class (Alabama youth ages 7 to 21 years old by January 1, 2009).

Classes and premiums to be determined when entry forms have been received.

Rules and Information for the Beef Cattle Show

1. All registration forms and entry fees must be mailed to Melody Barton, Attn: Livestock Show, 626 CO RD 383, Dutton, AL 35744 by September 1, 2009. **No Late Entries will be accepted. (For FORMS: Contact Melody Barton at 256-657-5664 or email: oldspringsfarms@yahoo.com)**
2. There will be a \$5.00 entry fee for each head of cattle entered for the Saturday Night Youth Show. Checks should be made payable to the Jackson County Fair Association. No refunds will be given for entry fees.
3. All entries must be in place at the Fair Ground by 5:00 p.m. on the day of the show. Commercial & Steer entries by 3:00 p.m. to be weighed.
4. Judging will begin at 6:00 p.m. and classes will be determined after receiving registration forms, each showing youngest to oldest. Commercial heifers & steers will be shown by weight from lightest to heaviest.
5. Six or more head of the same breed will have their own show. Five or less will be grouped as all other breeds.
6. Registration Certificates will be required of exhibitors for animals entered in the registered class.
7. To be eligible to compete for premiums all animals must be halter broken and well groomed. Cattle that are wild and are not in creditable condition will be ruled out. Eligibility to compete will be determined by the committee in charge. Their ruling will be final.
8. Feed and hay must be furnished by each exhibitor. Exhibitor must furnish feeding and watering containers. Bedding will be furnished.
9. The decision of the judges will be final.
10. All matters not covered by above rule will be referred to advisory committee and their decisions will be final.

11. Prize money will be awarded and mailed to exhibitor. Premium amounts will be based on number of entries received.
12. The Fair Association will not be responsible for any loss that may occur, but will give every exhibit the best attention possible. Liability Release forms must be signed by each exhibitor and mailed with entry forms.
13. No Food Allowed in Barn Area. No Alcoholic Beverages allowed on premises.

Wednesday Night – Show for Jackson County 4Her's only
(9-19 years old by January 1, 2009)

Heifers born after August 31, 2007 may be exhibited.
Commercial heifers and steers will be shown by weight.

Rules and information for the Jackson County 4-H Show

1. All entry forms must be mailed to the Jackson County Extension Office, Attn: Donna Sands, P.O. Box 906, Scottsboro, AL 35768 by September 1, 2009. There is no entry fee for the Jackson County 4-H Show. Contact Person: Donna Sands 256-574-2143.
2. All entries must be in place at the Fair Ground by 5:00 pm on the day of the show.
3. Judging will begin at 6:00 pm and classes will be determined after receiving registration forms.
4. Six or more head of the same breed will have their own show. Five or less will be grouped as all other breeds.
5. Registration certificates will be required of exhibitors for animals entered in the registered class.
6. To be eligible to compete for premiums all animals must be halter broken and well groomed. Cattle that are wild and are not in creditable condition will be ruled out. Eligibility to compete will be determined by the committee in charge. Their ruling will be final. **4-H guidelines must be followed.**
7. Feed and hay must be furnished by each exhibitor. Exhibitor must furnish feeding and watering containers. Bedding will be furnished.
8. The decision of the judges will be final.
9. All matters not covered by above rule will be referred to advisory committee and their decisions will be final.
10. Prize Money will be based on point system and check must be signed for and picked up by exhibitor at the Jackson County Extension Office no later than October 3, 2009.
11. The Fair Association will not be responsible for any loss that may occur, but will give every exhibit the best attention possible. A liability waiver must be signed by each exhibitor and mailed with entry forms.
12. No Food Allowed in Barn Area. No Alcoholic Beverages allowed on premises.

MEAT GOAT SHOW

1. The Goat Show will be Friday, September 25, 2009, at 6:30 p.m. at the Jackson County Fairgrounds. Enter fairgrounds through the side gate on Cecil Street.
2. Entries open to Alabama Youth (ONLY) 4 - 19 years old by January 1, 2009.
3. All registration forms and entry fees must be mailed to Melody Barton, Attn: Goat Show, 626 Co. Rd. 383 Dutton, AL 35744 by September 1, 2009. Checks should be made payable to the Jackson County Fair Association. **No Late Entries will be accepted and no refunds will be given for entry fees. (For FORMS: Contact Melody Barton at 256-657-5664 or email: oldspringsfarms@yahoo.com)**
4. Proof of address must be shown to the official at weigh in.
5. Entries may be doe, wether, or buck of any breed.
6. All entries should be less than one year old with milk teeth in place.
7. Entries should be in good health showing no signs of illness. The advisory committee reserves the right to reject any goat not meeting the above requirements.
8. All goats will be weighed and divided into 3 classes.
9. The showmanship contest shall consist of three divisions:
 1. 8 years old and younger
 2. 9 – 13 years old
 3. 14 year old and older
10. All entries must be in place at the Fairgrounds by 4:00 p.m. on the day of the show.
11. Participants must supply their own portable pens or tie ropes. Only tie rails are available at the show.
12. Participants must supply their own water buckets, feed pans, hay and hay racks. Water is available near livestock barn.
13. Observer stands are available but no other chairs are available.
14. The Fair Association will not be responsible for any loss that may occur, but will give every exhibit the best attention possible. Liability Waiver forms must be signed by each exhibitor and mailed with entry forms.
15. The decisions of the judge will be final.
16. All matters not covered by above rules will be referred to advisory committee and their decisions will be final.
17. Prize money will be awarded and mailed to exhibitor. Premium amounts will be based on number of entries.
18. No Food allowed in barn area. No Alcoholic Beverages allowed on premises.
